Offering of Letters: Reduce U.S. Poverty

In 2010, parishioners and students with Bread for the World can urge Congress to change U.S. Tax policy to benefit low-income families.

In the budget of a low-income family, food is often the most flexible item. Food is one place a struggling family cuts corners.

We know food assistance to hungry people is vital, but it is not enough. Progress against hunger requires broader efforts to reduce poverty. Low-income families live on the edge of a financial precipice. The car breaking down, a parent being laid off from her job, a child getting sick — any of these can mean the difference between having enough food or not.

Bread for the World's 2010 Offering of Letters will urge Congress to make changes in tax policy that will help low-income working families make ends meet.

Taxes will be near the top of the 2010 agenda in Congress because a series of tax cuts will be expiring. In the midst of the debate over which taxes to change and which to renew, the needs of low-income people could easily be lost. The 2010 Offering of Letters will ask Congress to strengthen key tax credits that can make a big difference for low-income workers and their families. One of these is the Earned

Income Tax Credit (EITC). The credit is considered by both Democrats and Republicans to be the best anti-poverty measure Congress has passed.

One of the ways in which the Book of Gospels is honored is that it is carried in procession during the Gospel Acclamation. On special occasions, this procession is accompanied by candles and/or incense. One interesting note is that candles never accompany the Book at the Gospel procession during the Easter Vigil. The Paschal candle is THE candle which is a primary symbol on that night, and it is the candle by which the Word of God is read.

WEEK 3 — LIVING IN TRUTH A JOURNEY TO THE CROSS LENTEN REFLECTION

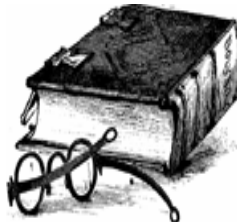
